WHEREAS, on May 24, 2023, Typhoon Mawar passed over Guam as a category 4 typhoon, which brought significant destruction to Guam, including disruption of power and water services, structural damage to homes and businesses, and disruption of communication services; and

WHEREAS, on May 25, 2023, President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. declared that a major disaster exists in Guam and ordered federal aid to supplement territory and local recovery efforts in the areas affected by Typhoon Mawar; and

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2023, *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* placed Guam back into Condition of Readiness (COR) 4, although Guam remains under a declaration of a state of emergency as declared by *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* in Executive Order No. 23-002; and

WHEREAS, power and water services have been restored to all Judiciary of Guam facilities; and

NOW, THEREFORE, by the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, I do **ORDER** that, because *I Maga'hågan Guåhan* has placed Guam back into COR 4, all employees of the Judiciary of Guam are called to report to their respective workstations on Tuesday, May 30, 2023, at 8:00 a.m. The Judiciary, recognizing that many island residents are still without power and water services, will only open to the public for limited court-related services and urgent proceedings starting at 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 30, 2023.
