ARTICLE 1
DIVISIONS OF INSTRUCTION

§ 32101. Secondary Division.

The Guam Vocational-Technical High School shall be maintained within this division. The high school shall be comparable in scope, programs and courses of instruction to those offered in the other public high schools in the Territory. The high school shall offer courses of instruction at the high school level and shall award to qualifying students a high school diploma and such other certificates as shall be provided by the Board. Instruction shall be in those courses necessary to meet the general requirements for high school graduation within the Territory as well as courses in the vocational and technical fields, provided that those courses offered to meet the general requirements shall be oriented toward the vocational and technical fields. The high school shall permit cross-enrollment of students among the several public and private high schools within the Territory.

The chief of the secondary division shall be designated the principal of the Guam Vocational- Technical High School.

§ 32102. Post-Secondary and Continuing Education.

The Post-Secondary and Continuing Education Division shall offer such vocational- technical and career programs as the Board shall determine. The programs may be either credit or non-credit and may be degree or non-degree programs.

§ 32103. Apprenticeship Training Division.

The division shall consider problems of developing local skills in the various crafts and trades and developing a program of apprenticeship training and apprenticeship standards in accordance with standards established by and acceptable for registration with the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, United States Department of Labor or its successor.

The Board shall, in cooperation with an appropriate advisory committee composed of members of the construction industry, general business community, labor community, the general public and the Department of Education formulate an apprenticeship program in the several vocational-technical career fields in which critical shortages of trained personnel exist.

§ 32104. Cooperative Programs Authorized.

The College is authorized to enter into contracts with public or private organizations, firms, companies or individuals to provide technical manpower training programs. Such contracts shall be utilized to provide for specialized training in particular fields not otherwise available within the College which are designed to train local persons in needed skills and at the same time to train employees to carry on such courses.

Any contract under this Section may require the training of College employees to continue teaching such a course on a self-sustaining basis after the initial contract period which shall not be in excess of three (3) years.

§ 32201. Guam Community College Training Programs and Unauthorized Training Liability.

There is within the Guam Community College a training academy herein referred to as the Guam Community College Training Programs, which *shall* provide support for:

(1) Local public safety training of all government of Guam personnel defined as peace officers in accordance with §32301(b) of Article 3 of Chapter 32 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated meeting all public safety training standards. This includes the establishment of a trainer program in conjunction with the respective public safety agencies/departments, as provided for in § 32201.10.

(2) All training within a technical/trade institution profession. This includes all current and planned programs under the Guam Community College's purview;

(3) *Shall* be a training agency for the Commission. Any references to "in-house" training and specialized training *shall* be administered by the respective agencies and separated from the initial requirement for academy training purposes. All certification made *shall* be limited to POST academy recruits *or* such certifications as promulgated by POST.

It is hereby established that any taxpayer may sue pursuant to 5 GCA § 7103A to hold Directors of agencies/departments personally liable for expending money without proper appropriation, without proper authority, illegally *or* contrary to law with regard to training of law enforcement personnel. Any liabilities resulting from personnel not certified under the "POST" Academy will be the personal responsibility of the Director/ Agency Head and *shall* not be covered under the color of law.

§ 32201.1. Cadre of Trainers.

Pursuant to 17 GCA Chapter 32 Article 2 § 32301.1 establishing the POST Cadre of Trainers, the Guam Community College *shall* enter into agreements with the Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission towards assigning trainers for POST certified training.

§ 32202. Transfer of Positions and Personnel.

(a) All positions and the employees occupying said positions on the effective date hereof in the Department of Education, the University of Guam, the Department of Labor and the Guam Vocational-Technical High School who are exclusively employed in the operation or administration of the programs except those relating to the Police Academy and the Corrections Academy set forth in Section 5 of this Act are hereby transferred to the Guam Community College.

(b) On September 28, 1978, all positions and the employees occupying said positions who are exclusively employed in the operation or administration of the Police Academy are transferred to the Guam Community College.

(c) On April 15, 1988, all positions and the employees occupying said positions who are exclusively employed in the operation or administration of the Corrections Academy are transferred to the Guam Community College.

§ 32203. Transfer of Appropriation.

All appropriations, federal funds, grants and other monies exclusively pertaining to or issued in connection with the programs except those relating to the Police Academy and the Corrections Academy identified in Section 5 of this Act in the Department of Education, University of Guam, Department of Labor or other departments of the government of Guam are hereby transferred to the Guam Community College, provided that if such transfer would be a violation of federal law, rule or regulation such transfer shall not take place until the appropriate federal consent to the transfer has been received.

§ 32204. Transfer of Property.

All personalty, facilities, equipment, supplies, records, files, books and other papers exclusively pertaining to the operation of the programs except those relating to the Police Academy and the Corrections Academy identified in Section 5 of this Act in the Department of Education, the University of Guam, the Department of Labor or other departments of the government of Guam are hereby transferred to the Guam Community College. On September 28, 1978, all personalty, facilities, equipment, supplies, records, files, books and other papers exclusively pertaining to the operation of the Police Academy are transferred to the Guam Community College.

§ 32301. Definitions.

For purposes of this Article:

(a) *Commission shall* mean the Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission.

(b) *Peace Officer* for the purpose of this article, *shall* mean the Chief of Police and *all* sworn officers of the Guam Police Department including reservists; the Chief and all officers of the Guam Airport Police; the Chief and all officers of the Guam Port Authority Police; the Director of Corrections, all uniformed Correction Officers and Parole Officers as well as such rehabilitation personnel of the Department of Corrections as are designated by the Director of Corrections; the Director of Customs and all sworn officers of the Customs and Quarantine Agency; the Director and all employees of the Department of Youth Affairs who are engaged in juvenile detention and rehabilitation work as designated by the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs; the Chief and all Conservation Officers of the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources of the Department of Agriculture; the Chief and all Guam Park Patrol Officers of the Department of Parks and Recreation; the Attorney General and those employed by the Attorney General's Office whom he specifically designates; the Chief Marshal and all Marshals and the Chief of Probation and all Probation Officers of the Unified Guam Judiciary; all Fire Fighter Personnel engaged in the enforcement of the Fire Prevention Code, all Arson Investigators and those GFD employees whom the Fire Chief specifically designate.

§ 32302. Created; Membership; Compensation; Meetings; Publications of Procedures; Standards for Certified Training; Powers and Duties.

(a) There is hereby created a Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission. The Commission *shall* be composed of the following members:

(1) the Chief of the Guam Police Department, *or* his designated representative;

(2) the Chief of the Guam Airport Police, *or* his designated representative;

(3) the Chief of the Guam Port Police, *or* his designated representative.

(4) the Attorney General, *or* his designated representative;

(5) the Director of Customs and Quarantine Agency, *or* his designated representative;

(6) the Director of the Department of Corrections, *or* his designated representative;

(7) the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs, *or* his designated representative;

(8) the Superintendent of the Guam Park Patrol Officers of the Department of Parks and Recreation, *or* his designated representative;

(9) the Chief of the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources of the Department of Agriculture, *or* his designated representative;

(10) one (1) person at large, selected by the Commission;

(11) one (1) non-voting representative from the University of Guam (UOG), appointed by the President;

(12) one (1) non-voting representative from the Guam Community College (GCC), appointed by the President;

(13) the Chief Marshal of the Unified Guam Judiciary, *or* his designated representative;

(14) the Chief of the Guam Fire Department, *or* his designated representative;

(15) the Chief Probation Officer of the Unified Guam Judiciary, *or* his designated representative;

(16) one (1) non-voting representative from the Department of Administration, appointed by the Director of Administration; and

(17) one (1) representative from the Mayors' Council of Guam.

(b) Members of the Commission *shall* receive no compensation, but *shall* be reimbursed under §§ 23103 and 23104 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated for travel and per diem expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. For purposes of compensation, attendance at meetings of the Commission *shall* be deemed performance by a member of the duties of his local governmental employment.

(c) The Commission *shall* hold at least four (4) meetings per year.

(d) The Commission *shall* establish and publish its procedures.

(e) The Commission *shall* establish standards for certification of peace officer training.

(f) The Commission *shall* establish reasonable fees for the application and processing for the certification of peace officers.

(g) The Commission in coordination with affected agencies *shall* establish:

(1) requirements and minimum standards for the certification of peace officers;

(2) categories of peace officer certification with respect to the duties and requirements of respective fields;

(3) minimum qualifications for peace officer training instructors;

(4) minimum training requirements for peace officers;

(5) collaboration with training providers and educational institutions to establish core curriculum for all designated programs;

(6) categories *or* classifications of advanced in-service training programs and minimum courses of study and attendance requirements with respect to the categories or classifications; and

(7) a time frame for full compliance with Commission requirements by respective departments and agencies.

(h) The Commission *shall*:

(1) visit and inspect peace officer training programs *or* their components at any appropriate time;

(2) adopt such rules and regulations as it deems proper to fully effectuate and carry out the purpose of this Article, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law;

(3) prescribe reasonable minimum qualifications relating *solely* to the physical, mental and moral fitness of persons recruited, appointed *or* retained as peace officers by the government of Guam;

(4) deny, suspend *or* revoke certification of peace officers for substantial failure to comply with this Article or the rules of the Commission, pursuant to procedures policies enacted pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law;

(5) recommend to the respective appointing authorities qualifications of candidates for the offices of Chief of Police, the Chief Marshal, the Chief Probation Officer, the Director of Corrections, and the Director of Customs and Quarantine Agency;

(6) provide management survey and managerial assistance as requested by corrections and law enforcement agencies;

(7) provide by rule for the reciprocity and recognition of equivalent entry level core basic training at a training center by law enforcement officers of the federal government, states *or* territories of the United States, and, also require such additional training for certification as the Commission deems necessary;

(8) provide by rule for the reciprocity and recognition of law enforcement officers of the federal government, states *or* territories of the United States with five (5) *or* more years of law enforcement experience. The Commission may waive the equivalent number of hours of training that an officer obtained in another jurisdiction and may require such law officer to complete training in Guam law;

(9) provide by rule for temporary certification of peace officers who have previously completed basic peace officer training but have since left service in good standing, provided that said peace officers *shall* satisfy standards and training requirements as set by the Commission;

(10) provide by rule for temporary certification of peace officers from other jurisdictions who have completed basic peace officer training and have since left service in good standing, provided that said peace officers satisfy standards and training requirements as set by the Commission;

(11) establish supervisory, managerial, and executive level standards and certification for the agencies covered by this Chapter; and

(12) may enter into professional development agreements with the Guam Community College, the University of Guam, *or* another suitable institution.

§ 32302.10. Termination of Commission Membership Upon Reorganization.

A Commissioner who is a member of the Commission, pursuant to § 32302 (a) of this Chapter, *shall* immediately lose membership upon a reorganization of the agency which the member represents.

§ 32303. Executive Director; Appointment; Powers and Duties.

(a) The Executive Director of the Commission *shall* be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Commission. The Executive Director *shall* be the chief executive officer of the Commission. The Commission *shall* establish the minimum qualifications for the Executive Director.

(b) With the approval of the Commission, the Executive Director may:

(1) certify Peace Officer training programs *or* institutions;

(2) certify peace officers who have satisfactorily completed training programs mandated by this Act;

(3) consult and cooperate with peace officer training academies in the development of basic and continuing education training programs for peace officers;

(4) consult and cooperate with the Guam Community College, the University of Guam, other institutions of higher education, *or* any POST certified advanced training programs for the development of specialized courses of study on Guam for peace officers in the areas of police science, police administration, the social sciences and other related areas;

(5) consult and cooperate with other departments and agencies concerned with peace officer training;

(6) report to the Commission at regular meetings of the Commission and at other times as required to recommend denial, suspension *or* revocation of certification of a peace officer to the Commission as deemed necessary; and

(7) act as a voting member of the Commission only in case of a tie.

§ 32303.10. Temporary Vacancy of the Executive Director.

If a temporary vacancy occurs in the position of Executive Director for any reason, the Commission *shall* select from among its voting members a designated representative who *shall* become the Acting Executive Director until such time the Commission appoints a new Executive Director.

§32303.20. Nexus Cadre of Trainers.

(a) The Guam Police Department, Customs and Quarantine Agency, Guam Fire Department, Department of Corrections, and the Department of Law *shall* respectively designate one (1) *or* more qualified employees to participate in the cadre of trainers of the *Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission (POST)*. The Commission, based on qualification and POST specialized training needs, *shall* establish training criteria for the cadre to train peace officer recruits for POST programs.

(b) The Commission may assign supervision and responsibility of a certified POST training program to a POST agency.

(c) Notwithstanding any other law affecting the reassignment of an employee as a POST trainer, the employee's participation *shall* be deemed part of his usual duties and he *shall* be compensated by his employing agency at his usual salary.

§32304. Qualifications for Employment as a Peace Officer; Loss of Certification for Felony Conviction; Termination from Employment.

(a) Within fifteen (15) days after the appointment, termination, resignation *or* death of any peace officer, written notice thereof *shall* be given to the Commission by the employing agency.

(b) No public official, Guam agency *or* any other person authorized by law to appoint peace officers on Guam *shall* appoint any person as a peace officer who does not meet the following qualifications. The person *shall*:

(1) be a United States citizen *or* a resident who is legally authorized to work within the United States and its territories;

(2) be at least eighteen (18) years of age;

(3) be fingerprinted; local and national fingerprint files *shall* be searched to determine if the applicant has a criminal record;

(4) not have been convicted in any civilian *or* military court of a felony, a crime involving moral turpitude, a crime of domestic *or* family violence, regardless of whether he has been pardoned *or* commuted by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* regarding such conviction;

(5) hold a high school diploma *or* evidence of an equivalent achievement;

(6) have good moral character as determined by a background

investigation; the hiring agency *shall* complete a background investigation defined by the Commission of any applicant for employment as a peace officer before the applicant may be employed *or* begin training as a peace officer;

(7) be free of any physical, emotional or mental conditions which might adversely affect his performance of duty as a peace officer; physical condition *shall* be evaluated by a person licensed to practice medicine; emotional and mental conditions *shall* be evaluated by a licensed psychologist or psychiatrist; and

(8) pass an oral interview examination by the hiring agency.

(c) Notwithstanding any general, specific *or* local law *or* charter to the contrary, no person *shall* receive an original appointment on a permanent basis *or* hold an appointment on a permanent basis as a peace officer, unless the person has been awarded a certificate by the Executive Director attesting to his satisfactory completion of an approved peace officer basic training program.

(d) Notwithstanding Subsection (c) of this Section, the Commission may waive the basic peace officer training program by reciprocity *or* equivalency pursuant to Subsections 32302(h)(8), (9), *or* (10) and certify applicants passing a written examination established by the Commission *or* an oral interview attesting to the applicant's ability in law enforcement. The applicant *shall* demonstrate that he satisfactorily completed a basic peace officer training program which, in the Commission's opinion, is comparable to that required by this Section.

(e) Notwithstanding any other law or Civil Service requirements, a person who is convicted of a felony, a crime involving moral turpitude, *or* a crime of domestic *or* family violence after his appointment as a peace officer is ineligible for continued employment as a peace officer. *If* the person has been certified under this Section, his certification *shall* be automatically revoked on the date of his conviction. The Executive Director *shall* notify the person and the person's employing agency upon revocation of certification under this Subsection.

(f) In the case of termination of a peace officer, the employing agency *shall* notify the Commission and the officer, in writing, of the termination setting forth in details the facts and reasons for the termination. *If* the officer is terminated for failure to comply with this Act, *or* rules

promulgated under it, the notice *shall* so specify. Any officer who has been terminated may present a written statement to the Commission responding to the claims made against him *or* setting forth the facts and reasons for the termination as he believes them to be, and that statement *shall* become a permanent part of the file. A potential employer may contact the Commission to inquire as to the facts and reasons an officer was terminated from any previous employing agency. Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the Commission *shall*, upon request, provide to the potential employer all pertinent information which is in its possession.

§ 32305. Certification without Compliance with Requirements of § 32304; Applicability of Civil Service Provisions.

(a) Notwithstanding any other provision within this Article, any person who has been employed on a permanent basis as a peace officer on Guam prior to the enactment hereof and who is currently employed as a peace officer *or* was previously employed as a peace officer for at least ten (10) years prior to enactment hereof, may be certified as a peace officer by the Executive Director without having complied with §32304(b) and (c).

(b) Nothing in this Act *shall* be construed to exempt any peace officer from the provisions *or* requirements of civil service.

(c) An employing agency may establish qualifications and standards for hiring and training that exceed the minimum qualifications and standards set by the Commission.

§ 32306. POST Fund.

(a) The Commission may solicit, apply to *or* accept grants of money *or* materials *or* property of any kind from the Federal government, the government of Guam, any agency *or* political subdivision of the government of Guam *or* any person and business upon the terms and conditions imposed by the grantor. The Commission *shall* establish and collect fees for the services it performs.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all funds received by the Commission in accordance with this Chapter *shall* be deposited within five (5) days of receipt with the Treasurer of Guam for credit to the “*POST Fund*” (Fund) established pursuant to Subsection (b) of this Section. Funds *shall* be used by the Commission to carry out its functions for administration, operations, training costs of peace officers, management surveys, research, management assistance, and other operating expenses and

encumbrances of the Commission in performing its duties and obligations as prescribed in this Chapter. The Executive Director *shall* be the Certifying Officer of the Fund.

(b) There is hereby created, separate and apart from other funds of the government of Guam, a fund to be known as the “*POST Fund*” (Fund). The Fund *shall* not be commingled with the General Fund and *shall* be kept in a separate account. The Fund *shall* be under the control of the Commission and the Director of Administration (Director). The Director *shall* administer the Fund and release the necessary monies upon request for expenditures by the Executive Director authorized by this Section. The Fund *shall* not be used for any purposes other than those enumerated *or* reasonably inferred herein *or* for purposes other than those relating to the Commission. In exercising its functions, the Commission *shall* endeavor to minimize costs of administration so that a maximum of Funds will be expended exclusively for the POST Commission for the purpose of providing training and other services to law enforcement agencies. The Director of Administration *shall* make a quarterly report to *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* of the condition of, and activity within the Fund.

(c) The POST Fund is hereby *excluded* from any transfer authority given to *I Maga’lahen Guåhan*. Any subsequent grant of authority to *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* to transfer funds categorically *or* in general from *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* must specifically identify the POST Fund as a source.

§ 32307. Saving Clause.

This Act does *not* explicitly pre-empt other laws *or* regulations that preserve to a greater degree the powers of *I Maga’lahen Guåhan* *or* the Judiciary; *provided*, that such laws *or* regulations are consistent, and do *not* otherwise restrict *or* interfere with, the operation *or* enforcement of this Act.

§ 32308. Conflicting Laws.

(a) **Federal Supremacy.** This Article does *not* restrict any person *or* government instrumentality from complying with Federal law *or* regulations.

(b) **Prior Conflicting Acts.** *If* a conflict arises between this Article and other local laws *or* regulations concerning training standards and certification of peace officers, this Article *shall* control.

§ 32309. Effective Date.

The Commission *shall* be established and become operational immediately. Incumbent peace officers *shall* have thirty-six (36) months from the date of the enactment of the rules and regulations required by §32302(h), to be POST certified, provided that the Commission may grant extensions to protect the integrity of agency operations.
