§ 11101. Lapse of Time Does Not Legalize.

No lapse of time can legalize a public nuisance, amounting to an actual obstruction of public right.

§ 11102. Abatement.

The remedies against a public nuisance are:

- 1. Information or complaint;
- 2. A civil action; or,
- 3 Abatement

The remedy by complaint or information is regulated by Title 8 of this Code [Criminal Procedure].

§ 11104. Remedies for Public Nuisance.

A private person may maintain an action for a public nuisance, if it is specially injurious to himself, but not otherwise.
