

NATURE OF WORK

This is complex professional forensic and psychological work for juvenile and adult offenders and their families involved in juvenile delinquency or criminal court proceedings or children and their families involved in family court. Services involve applying the most current research and theoretical concepts in psychology and forensic work to ensure that evaluation or treatment goals are achieved.

- Knowledge of specific forensic psychology issues, including competency to stand trial, criminal responsibility and prediction of future dangerousness.
- Knowledge of the principles and practices of clinical psychology, including psycho-diagnostic testing and assessments, forensic evaluations, therapeutic interventions, and research methodologies.
- Knowledge of current theories and practices in the field of child, adolescent and adult mental health.
- Knowledge of the most current Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM) series and application
 of techniques.
- Knowledge of psychotropic medications and their effects.
- Knowledge of related local laws, case law and courtroom procedures.
- · Ability to diagnose and treat mental illness in relationship to physical conditions.
- Ability to provide expert testimony about forensic
- and mental health issues, individual patient participation and response to treatment.
- Ability to deal effectively with emotionally disturbed children and adults.
- Ability to work effectively with potentially assaultive patients and those charged with a crime.
- Ability to function constructively under pressure and manage the risks involved in working with persons having complex, social, emotional and related problems.
- Ability to formulate diagnostic evaluations and develop individualized treatment
 plans.
- Ability to prepare accurate factual forensic and psychological reports.
