Law Day 2018 **Essay Contest**



What is Law Day?

Law Day is a national day set aside to celebrate the rule of law. Law Day underscores how law and the legal process have contributed to the freedoms that we all share.

The 2018 Law Day Theme Separation of Powers: Framework for Freedom

The United States Constitution and Guam's Organic Act set out systems of government with three distinct and independent branches—legislative, executive, and judicial. Government power is divided among the three branches, and each branch serves as a check on the power of the others.



To enter, students must write an essay addressing the following question:

Briefly describe the functions of each branch of government and explain why it is important to have a government with distinct and separate powers.

Contest Rules:

- Students from 6th-8th grade are eligible to participate.
- Essays must address the guestion above.
- Essays must be no more than 750 words, typewritten, and double-spaced.
- Essays must be the student's original work.
