## What Is Law Day?

Law Day is a national day set aside to celebrate the rule of law. Law Day underscores how law and the legal process have contributed to the freedoms that we all share.

## Law Week theme:

This year marks the 75th anniversary of the Liberation of Guam from Japanese forces in World War II. The 2019 Law Week theme, "Evolving Liberty: Guam 75 Years Later," calls on us to reflect on the development of the rule of law in Guam since Liberation, including the rights and liberties afforded to us—along with the challenges we still face—today.

## **CONTEST RULES**

- The contest is open to grades 3rd—5th
- The artwork should reflect the theme of "Evolving Liberty: Guam 75 Years Later"
- Artwork must be submitted on an 11" x 17" paper and must be the student's original work.
- Artwork can be drawn and/or colored with any art supplies (paint, watercolor, crayons, markers, etc.).
- Artwork will not be returned.
- Artwork will be judged according to its originality, creativity, and how well the artwork represents the theme.
