Law Day is a national day set aside to celebrate the rule of law. Law Day underscores how law and the legal process have contributed to the freedoms that we all share.

The 2019 Guam Law Week Theme:

Evolving Liberty: Guam 75 Years Later

This year marks the 75th anniversary of the Liberation of Guam from Japanese forces during World War II. The 2019 Law Week theme, "Evolving Liberty: Guam 75 Years Later," calls on us to reflect on the development of the rule of law in Guam since Liberation, including the rights and liberties afforded to us—and the challenges we still face—today.

To enter, students must write an essay addressing the following question:

What does this year's Law Week theme, "Evolving Liberty: Guam 75 Years Later," mean to you? In answering this question, include specific examples of some rights and liberties that have been afforded to the people of Guam since Liberation, as well as examples of challenges to liberty we continue to face today.

Contest Rules:

- Students from 9th-12th grade are eligible to participate.
- Essays must address the question above.
- Essays must be no more than 1,000 words, typewritten, and double-spaced.
- Essays must be the student's original work.
