PROMULGATION ORDER NO. 23-002-01

This matter comes before the court on the Guam Bar Association (GBA) Board of Governors' request for an order confirming the approval of the Board of Governors to increase the annual membership dues beginning the registration year 2024. In a letter from GBA President Jacqueline T. Terlaje, the court was advised that under GBA Rule 9 Finance, Section 2, the Board of Governors authorized an increase to the annual dues as follows: for Active and Temporary Active Members, increase from \$300.00 to \$450.00; for Inactive Members, increase from \$75.00 to \$225.00.

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF GUAM

There has not been an increase in GBA membership dues in two decades. *See* Supreme Court Case No. PRM03-009 (Nov. 19, 2003) (setting the current dues rate at \$300.00 for active members and \$75.00 for inactive members). The court finds that an increase in GBA membership dues is justified for the reasons set forth in the GBA President's letter and supports the Board of Governors' assessment that an increase is necessary for the GBA to operate its administration and improve the services to its members.
