NOTE: Rule-making authority cited for formulation of telephone tariff regulations by the Guam Telephone Authority, 12 GCA Chapter 7.

The exchange tariff regulations of the Guam Telephone Authority are reprinted here in form as exact as possible to those filed on March 7, 1979 with the Legislative Secretary. The substance of the regulations has not been changed. However, for the purpose of uniformity and ease of

use, a new system of numbering has been adopted by the Editor. It is hoped that the revised numerical system will eventually be substituted for that formulated by the Guam Telephone Authority.

**§4101. Tariff Definition.** (a) The material contained in this binder and entitled *Telephone Exchange Tariff* constitutes the legally issued telephone tariff of the Guam Telephone Authority. All tariff sections and pages shall be in full force and effect on the effective date thereof, notwithstanding failure to include any section or page in this binder for whatever reason.

(b) The term *Tariff*, as used throughout the Telephone Exchange Tariff, means and includes any rule and regulation, rate, charge or condition governing the provision of telephone service, as now in effect or as hereafter issued or amended.

**§4102. Authority.** The tariff herein set forth is issued by authority of 12 GCA Chapter 7. Any tariff provision which is regulatory in nature is deemed a "Rule and Regulation" notwithstanding any other terminology that may be used herein.

**§4103. Previous Rules Cancellation.** Any and all rules and regulations promulgated prior to the effective date of this page which are in conflict with the Telephone Exchange Tariff, now or hereafter issued, are hereby rescinded.

**§4104. Definitions.** (a) *Authority.* The term Authority as used herein means the Guam Telephone Authority unless otherwise indicated.

(b) *Auxiliary Line Service.* Auxiliary Line Service is additional individual line service furnished to supplement the main individual line service of a subscriber.

(c) *Base Rate Area.* A specific area, within which schedule rates for local exchange service apply without exchange line mileage.

(d) *Board.* The term Board as used in this tariff means the Board of Directors of the Guam Telephone Authority unless otherwise indicated.

(e) *Business and Residence Service.* Determination as to whether a subscriber's service should be classified as Business or Residence will be based on the character of use to be made of the service. The practice of advertising a telephone number in newspapers, on business cards or on

trucks should be a contributing but not an exclusive factor in determining the classification of service.

Service will be classified as Business Service where the use is primarily or substantially of a business, professional, institutional or otherwise occupational nature.

Service will be classified as Residence Service where the business use, if any, is merely incidental and where the major use is of a social or domestic nature.

(f) *Central Office Area*. The area within the subscriber's lines are connected to the Central Office operating unit, or units, established by the Authority to serve that area.

(g) *Commission*. The term Commission as used in this tariff means the Public Utilities Commission.

(h) *Continuous Property*. The term Continuous Property means a continuous plot of ground, including any buildings thereon, which is used exclusively by a customer (or by an authorized user of a customer's service) and which is not separated by a public thoroughfare or by property occupied by another. Property as used herein does not involve ownership, but means a unit or part of a unit either owned, leased or rented by a customer, as a rented office in a building.

(i) *Customer*. Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, cooperative organization or government agency provided with telephone service by the Authority.

(j) *Exchange Area*. An area for which a separate local rate schedule is provided. An exchange area may consist of one or more central office areas.

(k) *Exchange Station*. A station owned by a Authority and connected directly or indirectly with a central office of the Authority over its own lines:

(1) *Main Station*: A station directly connected with a central office switchboard by an individual or party line circuit.

(2) *Extension Station*: A station connected with a main station either directly or through some switching device, other than a PBX system.

(l) *Extra Listing*. An Extra Listing is any listing of a name or information in connection with a subscriber's telephone number beyond that to which he is entitled in connection with his regular service.

(m) *Grant in Aid of Construction.* A payment made by a customer to help defray unusual construction or installation costs when the revenue to be derived from the service to be furnished is not sufficient to warrant the Authority assuming the full cost of providing the necessary facilities.

(n) *Installation Charge.* A one-time, non-recurring charge to cover the extra costs involved in providing special equipment or service not contemplated in the normal service connection charge.

Installation charges are in addition to and not in lieu of service connection charges.

(o) *Joint User Service.* Joint User Service is an arrangement whereby an additional person or firm is permitted to use the service of an existing subscriber. This service is provided only when the joint user's telephone needs, in the judgment of the Authority, are not such as to require the provision of separate subscriber service.

(p) *Key System.* An arrangement of wiring which, by means of keys or otherwise, provides various combinations of main and extension stations on one or more lines.

(q) *Local Exchange Service.* Local Exchange Service provides for telephonic communication within the local Guam service area in accordance with the provisions of the Telephone Exchange Tariff, including the use of exchange facilities required to establish connection between an exchange station and the toll board.

(r) *Local Messages.* A Local Message is a communication between subscribers' stations with the Guam local service area.

(s) *Local Service Area.* That area throughout which a subscriber to local exchange service, at a given rate, obtains telephone service without the payment of a toll charge. In the case of Guam, there is only one local service area.

(t) *Long Distance Terminal.* A subscriber's station or PBX trunk used exclusively for toll service, and directly connected with the Toll Switchboard.

(u) *Manual.* As used herein the term Manual refers to manual operation or control as distinguished from an operation which is automatic or one which is controlled indirectly such as through the use of a dial and associated equipment.

(v) *Mileage Charge*. A charge for certain lines, circuits or channels which reflects both the distance involved and the type of usage.

(w) *Non-Listed Number*. A telephone number or service included in the information records but not "listed" in the public directory.

(x) *Non-Published Number*. A telephone number or service which is confidential and therefore not included ("published") in either the public directory or in the information records.

Requests for information relative to non- published numbers will be denied.

(y) *Private Branch Exchange System*. A Private Branch Exchange System is an arrangement of equipment, contracted for by a subscriber, consisting of switching apparatus with attendants' telephone, trunks to a central office and stations connected with the switching apparatus, thereby providing for telephonic intercommunication between these stations, and also communication with the general exchange system. (Throughout this Telephone Exchange Tariff the commonly used abbreviation "PBX" will in most cases be substituted for the words Private Branch Exchange.):

(1) *PBX Trunk*: A circuit connecting the PBX system with a central office.

(2) *PBX Station*: Any station (including the operating set or sets) connected directly or indirectly with a PBX system.

(3) *Battery Power*: Power furnished for talking and for operating lamp or visual signals and relays.

(4) *Ringling Current*: Current furnished by means of a circuit from a central office or other source of supply, to enable the PBX operator to signal the PBX stations or to permit the automatic signaling of a dial PBX station when dialed from another PBX station.

(z) *Private Line*. A circuit provided to furnish communication only between the two (2) or more telephones directly connected to it, and not having connection with either central office of PBX switching apparatus.

(aa) *Push Button Telephone System*. A type of key system employing combined telephone sets with push

buttons in the mounting and providing one or more of the following service features: line pickup, line hold, audible and visual signaling, intercommunication, local signaling and cutoff or privacy.

(bb) *Rate*. The term Rate as used herein means a monthly recurring charge for telephone service and/or equipment.

(cc) *Regrade of Service*. A change in service from one grade to another such as a change from 4-party to 2-party service (upgrade) or a change from 1-party to 4-party service (downgrade). Any change in service to a lower grade is always a "Downgrade" and any change to a higher grade is always an "Upgrade".

(dd) *Regulation*. As used in this Tariff a regulation is any rule or condition which governs the provision of telephone service.

(ee) *Rural Line Service*. Rural Line Service is a multi-party exchange line service provided in locations outside the base rate area with a maximum of ten (10) parties per line. In rural areas where sufficient plant facilities are available, there may be fewer than ten (10) parties per line and in some cases there may be as few as four (4) per line.

(ff) *Same Building*. The term Same Building means a structure built as a unit. Abutting buildings are treated as the "Same Building" when there is free internal access between the buildings. A suite of offices or residence units occupied by a customer in the "Same Building" is considered continuous property when these offices or units have a common wall or are located directly above or below each other.

(gg) *Semi-Public Telephone*. A Semi-Public Telephone is an "Exchange" station equipped with a coin collecting device, designed for a combination of subscriber and public usage at locations more or less public in character. Semi-Public Telephone service is considered as a form of subscriber service.

(hh) *Service Connection Charge*. A one-time, non-recurring charge to cover, in part, the cost of establishing a given class and grade of telephone service or subsequent additions to that service.

The Service Connection Charge contemplates the installation of a standard single-line telephone instrument,

or a switching key used in lieu thereof, on exchange or PBX lines or extensions of these lines.

(ii) *Service Suspension.* A denial of service to a subscriber for violation of one or more of the rules and regulations governing the provision of telephone service.

When service is suspended it is normally for a short period of time. Consequently, the various service records remain active and service is not terminated.

(jj) *Subscriber.* As used in this Tariff, a separate subscriber is involved at each location, or continuous property, where service is furnished. One (1) individual or firm may therefore be considered as two (2) or more separate "Subscribers". The privileges, restrictions and rates established for the subscriber to any class of service are limited to the service at one location; and no group treatment of service at several separate locations, furnished to one (1) individual or firm, is contemplated or implied.

(kk) *Supersedure of Service.* Supersedure of Service is defined as service previously furnished one (1) subscriber which is assumed by a second subscriber without any lapse in the rendition of service and where the second subscriber assumes all obligations for back billing, if any. The name only is changed.

(ll) *Supplemental Equipment and Service.* Equipment or service furnished in addition to a basic service or system to enhance its usefulness and service value but which is not necessarily essential to the basic service.

(mm) *Telephone Authority.* Telephone Authority means the Guam Telephone Authority.

(nn) *Termination of Service.* Termination of Service means the complete disconnection of a customer's service as distinguished from "Service Suspension". Termination of service is normally initiated by the customer but, for proper cause, may be initiated by the Authority.

Termination of Service does not mean termination of liability on the part of the customer for any amounts due the Telephone Authority for service rendered.

(oo) *Tie Trunk.* A circuit connecting two (2) PBX systems for the purpose of intercommunicating between the stations connected with such PBX switching apparatus. The circuit is not intended to provide for general exchange service through either of the PBX systems with which it connects.

(pp) *Toll Service*. Toll Service is that part of the total telephone service which is furnished between customers in Guam and customers in areas outside Guam in accordance with the rates and regulations approved by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

**§4105. General Regulations: General.** The general regulations specified herein are supplementary to the regulations contained in other sections of this Telephone Exchange Tariff. Any legal change in regulations or in rates acts as a modification of all subscribers' contracts as of the effective date of such change.

**§4106. Same: Applications.** Requests from subscribers for service, equipment, etc. may be made orally or in writing, and upon approval or installation of the service, become a part of the application. An applicant for service must pay all previous indebtedness to the Authority before telephone service will be furnished.

**§4107. Same: Installation of Wiring and Equipment.** All wiring and equipment on subscriber's premises will be installed by the Authority; and the Authority shall not be required to attach its equipment or lines to wiring not installed by it, except where such action is agreed to in advance or is specified in special agreements in connection with service which, in the judgment of the Authority, is in hazardous or inaccessible locations.

**§4108. Same: Defacement of Premises.** The Authority shall exercise due care in connection with all work done on subscriber's premises. No liability shall attach to the Authority by reason of any defacement or damage to the subscriber's premises resulting from the existence of the Authority instruments, apparatus and associated wiring on such premises, or by the installation or removal thereof, unless such defacement or damage is the result of the sole negligence of the Authority.

**§4109. Same: Ownership and Use of the Equipment.** Equipment, instruments and lines on subscriber's premises, furnished by the Authority, shall be and remain the property of the Authority, whose agents and employees have the right to enter said premises at any reasonable hour for the purpose of installing, inspecting or repairing of the instruments and lines or for the purpose of making collections from coin boxes and, upon termination of the service, for the purpose of removing such instruments and lines. Such equipment is not to be used for performing any part of the work of transmitting,

delivering or collecting any telephone message where any toll or consideration has been or is to be paid any party other than the Authority, without the written consent of the Authority.

**§4110. Same: Unauthorized Attachments or Connections.** No equipment, apparatus, circuit or device not furnished by the Authority shall be attached to or connected with the facilities furnished by the Authority, whether physically, by induction or otherwise, except as provided in this Tariff. In case any such unauthorized attachment or connection is made, the Authority shall have the right to remove or disconnect the same; or to suspend the service during the continuance of said attachment or connection; or to terminate the service.

**§4111. Same: Use of Service.** Subscriber telephone service is furnished only for use by the subscriber, his family, employees or business associates or persons residing in the subscriber's household, except as the use of the service may be extended to joint users or the persons temporarily subleasing a subscriber's residential premises. The Authority has the right to refuse to install subscriber service or to permit such service to remain on premises of a public or semi-public character when the instrument is so located that the public in general or patrons of the subscriber may make use of the service.

**§4112. Same: Use of Party Line Service.** Applications for party line service are accepted by the Authority with the understanding that each subscriber will so use the service as not to interfere with an equitable proportionate use of the service by the other subscribers on the same line. When the duration or number of local calls made or received by a party line subscriber is so great as to prevent an equitable proportionate use of the line by other subscribers on the line, the Authority shall have the right to discontinue the service of the subscriber in question. The Authority reserves the right to limit to five (5) minutes the continuous use of the party line for a local call.

**§4113. Same: Payment for Service.** (a) The subscriber is responsible for payment of all charges for facilities and services furnished, including charges for long distance messages originated, or charges accepted, at such facilities. All bills are due when rendered and are payable at the Authority's business office or at one of its designated agents:

(1) Local Exchange Service. Exchange charges for local service are billed once a month, in advance for one month's minimum charge.

(2) Toll Service. Toll messages and charges are billed in arrears and are payable upon request.

**§4114. Same: Telephone Numbers.** The subscriber has no property right in the telephone number or any right to continuance of service through any particular office. The Authority may change the telephone number or the central office designation, or both, of a subscriber whenever it deems it desirable in the conduct of its business to do so.

**§4115. Same: Interruptions to Service.** When requested by the subscriber, if service is interrupted for more than forty-eight (48) hours, and for cause other than the negligence or willful act of the subscriber, an allowance shall be made, at the minimum rate for the telephone facilities and class of service affected by the interruption, for such time as the interruption continues. No other liability shall attach to the Authority in consideration of such service interruption.

**§4116. Same: Telephone Directories. (a) Distribution:**

(1) The Authority distributes to its subscribers without charge such directory information as in its opinion is generally necessary for the efficient use of the service. Any additional directories or information requested will be furnished without additional charge where, in the opinion of the Authority, such provision will lead to a more efficient use of the service by that particular subscriber. Other directories will be furnished at the discretion of the Authority at a reasonable rate.

**(b) Ownership:**

(1) Directories regularly furnished to subscribers are the property of the Authority, are loaned to subscribers only as an aid to the use of the telephone service, and are to be returned to the Authority upon request or when new directories are issued. The Authority shall have the right to make a charge for directories issued in replacement of directories lost, destroyed, defaced or mutilated while in possession of subscribers.

**(c) Errors:**

(1) No liability arising from errors or omission in the making up or printing of its directories shall attach to the Authority except in the case of charge listings. In this case,

liability shall be limited to a refund at a monthly rate for each listing for the time an error or omission continues after reasonable notice in writing to the Authority or its directory agent.

**(d) Directory Attachments:**

(1) Subscribers may use with, or attach to, directories furnished by the Authority, binders, holders, inserts, auxiliary covers or attachments providing they do not contain advertising and are not so attached as to impede reference to essential service information otherwise interfere with service. No other binders, holders, inserts, auxiliary covers or attachments of any kind not furnished by the Authority shall be attached to or used with the directories furnished by the Authority.

**§4117. Same: Private Branch Exchange Operation.** All operating at the subscriber's premises is performed at the expense of the subscriber and must conform with the rules and regulations of the Authority.

**§4118. Same: Unusual Installation Costs.** When special conditions or special requirements of the subscriber involve unusual construction or installation costs, the subscriber may be required to pay a reasonable proportion of such costs.

**§4119. Same: Furnishing Party Line Service.** (a) Two-party service beyond the established base rate area will be furnished only when two (2) parties outside said area, but within one-quarter mile of each other, apply for service at the two-party rate.

(b) Four-party service beyond the established base rate area will be furnished only when at least three (3) parties outside said area, how are within a radius of one-quarter mile of each other, apply for service at the four-party rate.

**§4120. Same: One-Way Service.** (a) One-Way Incoming or Outgoing Service is furnished in connection with PBX Trunk Service.

(b) One-Way Service is furnished at the established rates for Two-Way Service as found in the appropriate Telephone Exchange Tariff section.

**§4121. Same: Use of Profane Language, Impersonation of Another, Nuisance Calls and Interference With the Service of Other Subscribers.** The Authority may refuse to furnish or may deny telephone service to any person, firm or corporation who, over the

facilities furnished by the Authority, uses or permits to be used foul, abusive, obscene or profane language; or impersonates or permits others to impersonate any other individual with fraudulent or malicious intent or permits others to call another person or persons so frequently or at such time of the day or in any manner as to harass such other person or persons or uses the service in such a manner as to interfere with the service of others or to prevent others from making or receiving calls over their telephone.

**§4122. Same: Tampering With Equipment.** The Authority may refuse to furnish or may deny telephone service to any person, firm or corporation on whose premises is located any telephone equipment which shows any evidence of tampering, manipulation or operation or use of any device whatsoever, for the purpose of the obtaining telephone service without payment of the charges applicable to the service rendered.

**§4123. Same: Maintenance and Repairs.** All ordinary expense of maintenance and repair unless otherwise specified in the Authority's Telephone Exchange Tariff, is borne by the Authority. In case of loss of, damage to or destruction of, any of the Authority's instruments or accessories, not due to ordinary wear and tear, the subscriber is held responsible for the cost of replacing the equipment destroyed or for the cost of restoring the equipment to its original condition, except where such damage is not occasioned by the negligence of the subscriber. Subscribers may not rearrange, disconnect or remove or permit others to rearrange, disconnect or remove, any apparatus or wiring installed by the Authority, except upon written consent of the Authority.

**§4124. Same: Transmitting Messages.** The Authority does not transmit messages but offers the use of its facilities when available for communications between parties, each of whom is present at the telephone.

**§4125. Arrangements With Other Systems.** When suitable arrangements can be made, lines of the military system may be used in establishing connections to points not reached by the lines of the Authority. In establishing connection with the lines of the military system, the Authority is not responsible or liable for service quality or continuity within the system.

**§4126. Special Regulations: Contract Periods.** (a) Except as otherwise provided, the initial (or minimum)

period for all services and facilities is one (1) month at the same location.

(b) The length of the contract period for directory listings, and for joint user service, where the listing actually appears in the directory, is the directory period. The directory period is from the day on which the directory is first distributed to the subscribers to the day the succeeding directory is first distributed to subscribers.

(c) For dial PBX systems of over fifty-line capacity, and for multiple manual PBX switchboards (but not including trunk lines and stations) the initial contract period is five (5) years (or as otherwise specified) at the same location. In the case of dial PBX systems of over fifty-line capacity when it becomes necessary to install any additional common equipment which entails large installation cost (such as line equipment or selector frames, power apparatus or additional switchboard positions); or in the case of multiple PBX systems when it becomes necessary to install additional switchboard positions; such additional equipment is subject to a minimum contract period of five (5) years (or as otherwise specified) from the date of installation.

(d) The Authority may require a contract period longer than one (1) month at the same location in connection with special (non- standard) types or arrangements of equipment, or for unusual construction, necessary to meet special demands of involving extra costs.

(e) Service may be terminated prior to the expiration of the initial contract period upon notice being given to the Authority ten (10) days in advance and upon payment of the termination charges given below in addition to all charges due for service which has been furnished:

(1) In the case of service for which the initial contract period is one (1) month, the charges due for the balance of the initial month.

(2) In the case of extra directory listings and joint-user service, where the listings has appeared in the directory, the charges due to the end of the directory period, except that in the following cases charges will continue only to the date of termination of the extra listing or joint-user service, subject, however, to a minimum charge for one (1) month:

(A) The contract for the main service is terminated.

(B) The listed party or joint-user becomes a subscriber to some class of exchange service.

(C) The listed party or joint-user dies.

(3) In the case of PBX service for which the initial contract period is five (5) years (or as otherwise specified) in the same location, such proportion of the sum of the cost of installing and removing the equipment involved (not including trunk lines and stations), plus the loss on account of power plant, as the unexpired portion of the initial contract period bears to the full initial contract period.

(4) In the case of special equipment for which the initial contract period is in excess of one (1) month at the same location, such proportion of the sum of the cost of equipment and of its installation, plus the cost of removal, less the salvage value of the equipment removed, as the unexpired portion of the initial contract period bears to the full contract period.

(f) Service may be terminated after the expiration of the initial contract period, upon the Authority being notified ten (10) days in advance and upon payment of all charges due to the date of termination of the service.

**§4127. Same: Establishment and Re-establishment of Credit.** (a) The Authority is not obligated to furnish telephone service to any individual or firm that owes the Authority for service previously rendered at the same or a different address, until arrangements have been made to liquidate such previous indebtedness to the Authority.

(b) In order to insure the payment of all charges due for its service, the Authority may require any subscriber to establish and maintain his credit in one of the following ways:

(1) By furnishing references acceptable to the Authority.

(2) By providing a suitable guarantee in writing, in the form prescribed by the Authority.

(3) By means of a cash deposit.

The Authority shall be the sole judge as to whether or not the references or guarantee in writing would be acceptable.

(c) The amount of deposit required for the purpose of establishing a subscriber's credit shall not exceed his estimated bill for exchange service and toll charges for one normal billing period plus forty-five (45) days.

(d) The Authority may require the subscriber to increase the amount of the deposit at any time if, in its opinion, the charges billed against the subscriber are found to warrant such an increase.

(e) The fact that a deposit has been made shall in no way relieve the applicant or subscriber from complying with the regulations of the Authority as to advance payments and the prompt payment of bills on presentation, nor constitute a waiver or modification of the regular practices of the Authority providing for the discontinuance of service for non-payment of any sums due the Authority for service rendered. The Authority may discontinue service to any subscriber failing to pay current bills without regard to the fact that such subscriber has made a deposit to secure payment of such bills or has furnished the Authority with a guarantee in writing of payment of such bills.

(f) No interest shall be paid by the Authority on any deposit made for the purpose of establishing credit.

(g) Service may be discontinued for failure to establish credit, as authorized above, within ten (10) days after the Authority has served or mailed notice requiring the subscriber to do so.

(h) Where service has been discontinued for failure to establish credit as authorized by these regulations, the regular restoral charge will be made and collected by the Authority.

**§4128. Same: Complaints.** (a) A customer who in good faith believes that he has been incorrectly billed for services may provide a complaint to the Authority. Upon receipt of such a customer complaint and the proper deposit, the Authority shall undertake an investigation into the matters raised in the complaint and shall forthwith furnish the customer with a statement indicating the right of appeal and adjustment of account including a credit for or return of any deposit or part of deposit and interest at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum if the statement

indicates an adjustment is due the customer. If the Authority's statement indicates that the dispute should be resolved in favor of the Authority, the customer's account shall be charged an amount equal to the amount of interest payable at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum on the disputed amount during the time that the dispute was outstanding and the deposit shall be paid to the Authority.

(b) The customer's complaint must detail the reasons why he believes a billing or other action of the Authority is erroneous.

(c) Disconnection or termination of services shall not be undertaken by the Authority with respect to the disputed amount until expiration of thirty (30) days from the date the Authority's statement is mailed or otherwise provided to the customer.

(d) If the Authority's statement is adverse to a customer, the customer may within ten (10) days of the issuance of the statement take appeal to the Commission. During the pendency of the appeal, no action adverse to the customer with respect to the disputed amount may be taken. The taking of appeal shall operate as a stay and the Authority's determination shall remain in effect until final adjudication of the appeal provided that the deposit shall remain in escrow until resolution of the appeal. The Commission shall render its decision on the appeal no later than thirty (30) days after receipt of the notice of appeal. The Commission's decision will be final.

(e) Coincident with the submission of a complaint to the Authority, the customer will also submit a cash deposit in an amount equal to the amount of the disputed billing provided that it shall not exceed an amount equal to the average of three (3) months' billing prior to the time that the dispute arose.

**§4129. Same: Priorities.** (a) The following system establishes priorities by which telephone services are established, restored and/or repaired if limited resources, disasters or other conditions require a choice as to scheduling of work:

**Category I - Public Health and Safety.** (Government individuals, agencies and authorities charged with responsibilities for defense, public safety, public works, public utilities, supply and transportation, health and medical emergencies and disaster relief functions; private individuals, organizations and groups operating voice and

telegraph communication systems, medical, ambulance and other public health and safety functions; residential services for individuals regularly assigned responsibilities public health and safety; and military.)

**Category II - Government.** (Government individuals, agencies and authorities with regular responsibilities other than those involving public health and safety.)

**Category III - News Media.** (Daily newspapers, broadcast television stations, cable television, etc.)

**Category IV - Business Services.** (Commercial businesses not covered by the above categories.)

**Category V - Residence Services.** (Other than those covered under Category I.)

**Category VI - Other Services.** (Moves, changes, rearrangements and discontinuance of service.)

(b) The priority system set forth herein does not cover all cases and decisions may be necessary in its administration. In cases where decisions are necessary, responsibility is assigned to the Authority's general management.

**§4130. Local Exchange Services: General.** (a) The Authority's obligation to furnish exchange service is dependent upon its ability to secure and retain, without unreasonable expense, suitable facilities and rights for the construction and maintenance of the necessary right-of-way, circuits and equipment.

(b) The Authority reserves the right to specify the grades of service offered in each exchange area, including the right to require upgrades and to withdraw the offering of party and rural line services.

(c) Upgrades from party or rural line to individual line service will be scheduled and reasonable advance notice provided to affected subscribers as facilities become available. The withdrawal of party or rural line service offerings will be effected for each exchange as all such party and rural line services are eliminated from that exchange.

(d) Mileage charges do not apply to individual, party or rural line services.

**§4131. Same: Rates.** The following basic monthly rates are applicable to business and residence primary (main) telephone service. The Authority provides one standard

instrument per service. All special or supplementary equipment and extensions are furnished at rates and charges specified elsewhere in this Tariff:

**§4132. Extension Services. (a) General:**

(1) Extension services are provided in connection with any grade or class of primary telephone service, including semi-public pay station service.

(2) Extension lines may terminate either in telephone instruments or in switching keys used in lieu of telephone instruments.

(3) The extension station rates listed herein cover locations within the same building and on the same continuous property as the primary station.

(4) Extension stations located on non- continuous property within the same building or located outside of the building in which the primary service is located will be furnished at the rates listed herein plus mileage rates as set forth in the tariff section entitled "Mileage Charges" and are subject to the conditions listed in that Tariff.

**§4133. Service Connection and Move and Change Charges: General - Service Connection Charges.** (a) The term Service Connection Charge is used to define the charge made at the time of the establishment of a class of telephone service or subsequent additions to that service. The charge is intended to cover, in part, the costs incident to establishing telephone service and the connection of the service with the telephone system.

(b) No distinction is made between a "New Installation" and an "Outside Move". All changes of subscribers' equipment or service (except as otherwise provided under "Inside Moves and Changes") are treated as new service connections with Service Connection Charges applying, regardless of the existence of any wiring or instrumentalities which may be in place.

(c) Service Connection Charges are in addition to any other scheduled rates and charges normally applying under the Tariff. They apply in addition to and not in lieu of Mileage Charges, Installation Charges or Construction Charges made because of unusual cost in establishing service.

(d) Service Connection Charges are payable at the time application is made for the particular service or facility, and prior to the establishment of service, except in the case of additions to existing service or in the case of any service billed to the government of Guam or to the Federal government.

**§4134. Same: Application of Service Connection Charges.** (a) Service Connection Charges apply as follows:

(1) Main stations, PBX trunks, central office lines terminating in key equipment, long distance terminals, private line terminals and tie trunk terminals:

(A) Business, each item	\$45.00
(B) Semi-Public, each item	\$45.00
(C) Residence, each order	\$35.00
(2) Business or residence extension stations, PBX stations and extension lines terminating in Key Equipment	\$20.00
(3) Reconnection of disconnected PBX trunks	\$20.00
(4) Supersedure of telephone service, each	\$20.00

**§4135. Same: Supersedure of Service.** (a) Supersedure of service is defined as service previously furnished one subscriber which is assumed by a second subscriber upon due notice of cancellation by the first subscriber or in case of abandonment, provided there be no lapse in the rendition of service.

(b) A new subscriber is permitted to supersede the service of another only if he fully understands the regulations governing the service and status of the account and willingly assumes all obligations thereunder including unpaid directory advertising. The new subscriber is required to sign a new application form and bills are rendered to him without an adjustment to or from any particular date, the name only being changed.

(c) The supersedure charge applies for both business and residence services except in cases specifically covered in §4136 below.

**§4136. Same: Instances Where Service Connection Charges Do Not Apply.** (a) "Public Paystations" established for the use of the general public (but not including Coin Box Service at locations which are classed as semi-public).

- (b) Operators' Sets.
- (c) Battery or Ringing Supply Circuits.
- (d) Directory Listings or Joint User Service.

(e) The following cases, provided service and facilities are assumed prior to their discontinuance and without lapse in rendition of charges or payment for service:

(1) A change of name without a change of interest.

(2) A change of interest without a change of name.

(3) When one member of a family applies for the service previously contracted for by another member of the same family residing in the same household.

(4) When the subscriber's name has been changed by marriage or court order.

(f) When a receivership is established or terminated.

(g) Service changed from a residence to a business classification or vice versa, without change in the identity of the subscriber, except when the original classification is known to have been erroneously established.

(h) Residence extensions installed:

(1) At the same time as main station service is established on the same premises.

(2) Simultaneously with another residence extension on the same premises for which a service connection charge is applied.

(3) When an installer's visit to the subscriber's premises is necessitated by a change in central office operation.

(4) In connection with a change to a higher class or grade of residence service.

**§4137. Same: General - Inside Moves and Changes.** (a) Except as otherwise provided herein, the charges for Inside Moves and Changes are in no case to exceed the sum of the Termination Charges (if any) for the existing service at the old location and the Service Connection Charges (and any installation charges) which would apply if all the facilities were installed anew.

(b) The charges specified herein for Inside Moves and Changes do not contemplate work being performed by the Authority employees at a time when overtime wages apply; nor does it contemplate work once begun being interrupted by the subscriber. If the subscriber requests overtime labor being performed or interrupts work once begun, a charge in addition to the specified charges will be made equal to the additional cost involved.

**§4138. Same: Application of Charges for Inside Moves and Changes. (a) Inside Moves:**

(1) An inside move is a transfer of telephone service or equipment from one location to another location within the same building or that portion of the same building occupied by the same subscriber, where there is no interruption of the service other than is incidental to the work involved.

(2) A change in location from one premises to another will not be treated as a move, but as a disconnect and a new installation.

(3) A temporary removal or rearrangement of a subscriber's telephone facilities or equipment to permit redecorating or remodeling of the premises, or to permit changing the furniture or fixtures within a premises, will be considered as a move and the move and change charges will apply.

(4) Charges for inside moves of telephone service or equipment will apply as follows:

(A) Ordinary Inside Moves of individual and party line main stations, PBX stations, extension stations and other station apparatus:

(5) The charges shown above for moves of stations apply to PBX service and Key System service when only the stations are moved. Where the move involves a move of both stations and other equipment, the charge for the entire move will be the actual cost.

(6) In the case of equipment for which the initial contract period is more than one (1) month at the same location, the subscriber may arrange for the change of location on the same premises, or to a different premises, by one of the following methods:

(A) By terminating the contract for service at the old location and signing a new application. In this case, the subscriber is required to pay the sum of any

termination charges which may be applicable, plus service connection charges which would apply in case of a new installation.

(B) By paying the actual cost of making the change in location including the cost of removing all of the equipment from the old location and the cost of installing the equipment at the new location. In this case, the contract period is not affected.

**(b) Changes in Equipment or Wiring:**

(1) A change in equipment or wiring is a substitution of a different type of telephone equipment, a change of color, or a rearrangement of equipment or wiring, which does not involve a change in location of the instrument.

(2) Charges for changes in regular telephone equipment, wiring or color made at the initiative of the subscriber will apply as follows:

(A) Changes in wiring or in style, type or color of telephone stations or changes in type of hand telephone set mountings, per order:

1. Business and Semi-Public

a) First station \$15.00

b) Additional stations, each \$ 7.00

2. Residence, one or more stations \$15.00

**NOTE:** The above "additional stations" charge also applies to Business and Semi-Public telephones at the time of other work on the same premises for which a service connection or move charge is applicable.

(B) Changes in other equipment and wiring  
Cost

**§4139. Same: Changes of Telephone Numbers.** (a) When a telephone number is changed at the request of the subscriber and is not required by the Authority "for the good of the service", the following change charge is applicable:

(1) Business number change, each \$15.00

(2) Residence number change, each \$15.00

**§4140. Same: Instances Where Charges for Inside Moves and Changes Do Not Apply.** (a) Inside moves or changes required for the proper maintenance of the equipment or service.

(b) Inside moves or changes made at the time of a change in the class or grade of service, provided that such inside move or change is necessary because of the change in the class or grade of service.

(c) Changes in style or type of regular station equipment made at the time of an inside move of the station: i.e., only the charge for the inside move is made.

(d) Changes from one length of cord to another length, except as provided in the tariff section entitled "Miscellaneous and Special Equipment and Service".

(e) Changes in the type of an operator's set.

(f) Inside moves or changes of public telephone to which no service connection charges apply.

(g) Changes in type or style of regular station equipment left in place when such change is desired by the incoming subscriber at the time service is established.

(h) Inside moves or changes of residence stations made at the time of other work on the same premises for which a Service Connection Charge is applicable.

(i) Changes for residence stations made at the time another residence station is being moved on the same premises.

(j) Changes of telephone numbers initiated by the Authority for technical reasons or which are for the good of the service.

(k) Changes in grade of service, except an upgrade to PBX service, which will be made on the basis of cost, and a downgrade from PBX service, which will be made on the basis of the regular service connection charge for the lower grade of service.

**§4141. Non-Payment Suspension and Restoral of Service. (a) General:**

(1) In the event that any sum due the Guam Telephone Authority (except as provided in §4141(a)(3) below) is not paid on or before the 14th day after the issuance of the bill, a written notice will be sent to the subscriber, calling attention to the fact that the amount is due; and if payment is not made within ten (10) days thereafter, the Authority will suspend telephone service without further notice.

(2) In the case of semi-public coin box service, if any amounts due are not paid on or before the 14th day after the issuance of the bill, a written notice will be sent to the

subscriber, calling attention to the fact that the amount is due; and if payment is not made within ten (10) days thereafter, the Authority will suspend telephone service without further notice.

(3) Special toll bills, which may be rendered at any time by the Authority, are payable upon presentation and if not paid at once a notice will be forwarded to the subscriber stating the amount due and notifying the subscriber that if payment is not made within ten (10) days thereafter, the Authority will suspend telephone service without further notice.

**(b) Charges:**

(1) When the telephone service of a subscriber has been suspended in accordance with the preceding paragraphs, but the service has not been terminated or the order to remove the service has not been completed, if such service is restored, a Restoral of Service Charge will be made. Further, where service has been denied, in addition to the Restoral of Service Charge, the subscriber will be required to pay all service charges up to the time of restoral of service.

(2) Subsequent to the completion of an order to terminate the service, it will be re-established only upon the basis of a new service application.

(3) Restoral of Service Charge                      \$20.00

**§4142. Public Telephone Service.** (a) **General.** A public telephone is an exchange station installed at the initiative of the Authority or at its option, at a location chosen or accepted by the Authority as suitable and necessary for furnishing service to the general public.

(b) **Purpose of Public Telephones.** Public telephones are installed for the use of the general public and their use by occupants of the premises in which they are located is only incidental to their principal purpose.

**(c) Selection of Location:**

(1) The Authority recognizes its responsibility for providing adequate telephone facilities and to meet all reasonable public requirements, and the decisions as to the extent, character and location of the public telephone facilities rests with the Authority.

(2) In the selection of premises the Authority endeavors to secure the most suitable of those available for

the purpose, public convenience considered. The character of the premises or the location of the equipment should not be such as to offer risk to the equipment or receipts of the Authority.

(d) **Message Charge.** A charge of Twenty-Five Cents (\$0.25) applies to each message.

**§4143. Semi-Public Telephone Service (a) General:**

(1) Semi-public service is in general designed to meet telephone service requirements at the following types of locations:

(A) Where there is an appreciable demand for service on the part of transients but where the installation of a public telephone is not warranted.

(B) Where there is a collective use of the service by a relatively stable body of guests, members, employees or occupants.

(C) Where the demand of service is for a combination of subscriber and transient usage, but not where such demand is primarily in connection with the subscriber's business.

(2) Semi-public telephone service is business line service equipped with a coin box, and where there is an appreciable number of incoming calls for guests, employees and occupants, business extension stations for answering inward calls may be installed when in the judgment of the Authority the location of the extensions with respect to the location of the coin box telephone is such as to make such usage satisfactory.

**(b) Message Charge and Daily Guarantee:**

(1) A charge of Twenty-Five Cents (\$0.25) applies to each local message.

(2) The subscriber shall guarantee a daily revenue of Three Dollars (\$3.00) from coin deposits for local messages. In the event the guarantee is not met for the elapsed number of days between coin collections, the subscriber will be billed in the difference between the amount collected and the amount guaranteed for the number of days involved.

**§4144. Joint User Service. (a) General:**

(1) Joint user service is an arrangement whereby a non-subscriber (an individual, firm or corporation) whose telephone needs are not such as to justify the

provision of separate subscriber service is permitted to use the service of a subscriber.

(2) Joint user service is not furnished in those cases where a subscriber is primarily engaged in furnishing service of a secretarial nature or is in the business of renting space to transient or permanent tenants and desires to furnish telephone service to his lessees nor will it be furnished in connection with business semi-public service.

(3) Joint user service is provided only in connection with business individual line and private branch exchange service. Only two (2) joint users may be permitted on each two-way line.

(4) The joint user must be located in the same room or suite of rooms as the subscriber and, furthermore, must be so located as to be accessible to the telephone to be used.

(5) Application for joint user service and for additional service, equipment or facilities in connection therewith must be executed by the subscriber who is responsible for payment of all charges incurred thereunder.

(6) No separate call numbers or other distinctive designations are provided for the purpose of signaling the joint user.

(7) Joint user rates apply when:

(A) The subscriber's service is used for another business which is publicly conducted by the subscriber and which is different in character or scope and in name from the business for which the facilities are furnished.

(B) Service (and an alphabetical directory listing) is desired over the facilities of the subscriber in the name of another individual, firm, company, corporation or association represented by the subscriber and the use of the name to be listed is authorized by the owner of the name.

(8) Charges for joint user service date from the day the information records are posted.

(b) **Rates:**

(1) Joint user service, including one listing in the alphabetical section of the telephone directory, is furnished at the following monthly rates for each joint user:

a. Joint use of business individual line service	\$ 9.50

**§4145. Directory Listings. (a) General Regulations:**

(1) The regulations for directory listings, shown in this Section, apply only to the information records and the alphabetical directory or that section of the directory containing the regular alphabetical list of names of subscribers.

(2) The alphabetical list of names of subscribers is designed solely for the purpose of informing calling parties of the telephone numbers of subscribers and those entitled to use subscribers' service. Special arrangements of names is not contemplated, nor any form of listing which does not facilitate directory service, or is otherwise objectionable or unnecessary for purposes of identification.

(3) Directory listings shall be limited to the following:

(A) In connection with residence service:

1. The individual name of the subscriber.
2. The individual name of a member of the subscriber's family or a person residing in the subscriber's household.

(B) In connection with business service:

1. The individual name of the subscriber or joint user.
2. The name under which the subscriber or joint user is actually doing business as evidenced by signs on the premises, by

letterheads and by the name under which bank accounts are carried.

3. The name under which a business is actually being conducted by someone other than the subscriber and which the subscriber or joint user is authorized by such other to use.

4. The individual names of the officers, partners or employees of the subscriber.

(C) Whenever any question arises as to the right of a customer to list the name of a business which he claims to represent, or to use a listing which includes the trade name of another, the Authority is privileged to require the customer to secure from the owner of such name or trade name a written statement of authority. Such statement shall be addressed to the Authority and shall specifically authorize the customer to use, or continue to use, the owner's name or trade name in a telephone directory listing. The Authority is further privileged to refuse acceptance of such listing, or privileged to delete such listing where:

1. Written authority is not furnished as requested and required; or

2. Authority is withdrawn by the owner in writing to the Authority.

**(b) Rates:**

**(1) Primary Listings:**

a. One listing without charge, termed the primary listing, is provided for each separate subscriber service and for each joint user.

**(2) Extra Listings:**

a. For each extra listing or line of information dating from the day the information records are posted:

Rate Monthly

1. Business and Residence \$ 1.00

(3) Non-List and Non-Published Numbers:

(A) For each service not listed in the public directory but included in the information records dating from the day the information records are posted:

Rate Monthly

1. Business and Residence \$ 1.00

(B) For each service not published (not included in the public directory or the information records) dating from the day information records are deleted or, in the case of new service or the assignment of a new number, from the day the new service or new number becomes effective:

Rate Monthly

1. Business and Residence \$ 2.00

**§4146. Mileage Charges: General.** (a) The mileage charges shown herein apply separately for each circuit except that, when the number and location of circuits on private property warrant the provision of cable, the following regulations and charges shall apply at the option of the subscriber:

(1) The Authority makes every effort to furnish and maintain cable of sufficient size to care for present and estimated future requirements.

(2) An initial charge equivalent to the installation costs and a monthly rental based on the carrying charges of the cable apply.

(3) The cable shall be used exclusively in connection with service rendered by the Authority to the subscriber.

(b) Mileage charges or carrying charges apply in addition to any service and equipment charges.

**§4147. Same: Extra Exchange Line Mileage. (a) General:**

(1) Where exchange telephone service other than rural line service is furnished outside the Base Rate Area, mileage charges apply for each main station or PBX trunk. Mileage charges are based on the airline distance from the main station or PBX to the nearest point on the boundary of the Base Rate Area.

(b) Mileage Charges, Business or Residence:

**§4148. Same: Extension Lines, Tie Lines, Private Lines and PBX Station Lines. (a) General:**

(1) Extension lines are furnished in connection with main station service, to locations of different individuals, firms or corporations who have and continue to have direct central office service at the locations where the extensions are furnished.

(2) PBX stations are furnished at locations of individuals, firms or corporations other than the subscriber to the PBX service, provided such individuals, firms or corporations have and continue to have direct central office service at the locations where the PBX stations are furnished.

(3) Tie lines are furnished to connect two (2) PBX switchboards. When the switchboards are not contracted for by the same individual, firm or

corporation, both switchboards must be connected to the central office by exchange trunk lines.

(4) When the subscriber desires the installation of special equipment or arrangements in addition to that which is regularly furnished, and where it is possible to furnish such special equipment or arrangements, a charge based upon the costs incurred will apply.

(5) The term Continuous Property as used herein will be interpreted as defined in §4104 except that shops located in the main building of a hotel will be considered as being on the continuous property of the hotel and thus entitled to joint user service off of the hotel PBX without mileage charges.

**(b) Rates:**

(1) The following rates apply to PBX Terminals, Extension Lines, Tie Lines and Private Lines:

(2) For private lines, in addition to the mileage charge, one or more of the following charges apply:

(A) Regular business extension rate as shown in §4132 for each regular telephone instrument.

(B) Private line terminating equipment rate as shown in §§4156 through 4161 for ringdown signaling.

(C) Auxiliary ringing equipment rate as shown in §§4166 through 4182.

(3) Each end of a Tie Line or Private Line is subject to the regular business main station service connection charge as provided in §§4133 through 4140.

(4) For extension lines and PBX Terminals, the regular extension or PBX Terminal station rate, as appropriate, applies for each line terminating in an instrument or other equipment, in addition to the above mileage rates.

(5) No mileage charge applies for each residence extension line to a location not in the same building but on the same continuous property and not requiring more than three hundred (300) feet of wiring.

**§4149. Same: Channels for Signaling, Metering, Control and Other Special Purposes. (a) General:**

(1) Cable conductors will be provided where facilities are available to be used as channels for

remote metering, supervisory control, alarms and miscellaneous signaling purposes.

(b) Rates for signaling and control channels are as follows:

(d) Installation and Move Charges:

(1) Installation and outside move charges per termination are as specified for business main station service connection charge and inside move charges as indicated in §§4133 through 4140 of this Tariff.

**§4150. Same: Telex or Teletypewriter Loops and Teletypewriter Private Lines. (a) General:**

(1) Telex or teletypewriter loops and private lines are circuits or channels furnished by the Authority for use in connection with teletype instruments.

(b) **Rates:**

(1) Mileage charges for channels are as specified for private lines in §4148 preceding.

**§4151. Same: Customer Created Channels.** (a) In addition to applicable mileage charges for the basic channel, the following rate applies to any additional channels created by the customer:

**§4152. Grants in Aid of Construction: General.** (a) All rates and charges quoted in other sections of this Tariff provide for the furnishing of service or channels when suitable facilities are available or where the construction of the necessary facilities does not involve unusual costs.

(b) When the revenue to be derived from the service or channels is not sufficient to warrant the Authority, assuming the unusual costs of providing the necessary construction, the customer may be required to pay all or a portion of such costs as a grant in aid of construction, the amount depending upon the circumstances in each case. Such "Grants in Aid of Construction" (construction charges) are not refundable.

(c) Where a customer is so located that it is necessary to use private right-of-way to furnish a service or channels and the Authority is unable to obtain the required right-of-way without cost, the customer may be required to pay the entire costs involved in securing such right-of-way.

(d) When attachments are made to poles of another agency in lieu of providing pole line construction for which the customer would be charged under the provisions of §§4152 through 4155, the cost to the Authority of such attachments and the cost of obtaining the use of such poles is borne by the customer.

(e) Title to all construction, except pole lines or conduit provided on private property at the customer's expense, is vested in the Authority.

(f) Construction charges are payable at the time application for service is signed or when the account is rendered, at the option of the Authority. A deposit on construction charges may be required before construction work is started.

(g) *Cost*, as used in §§4152 through 4155, is to be interpreted to mean the cost of labor and materials, including charges for supervision and other overhead expenses.

(h) Any pole line or underground construction furnished by the customer is subject to the approval of the Authority.

**§4153. Same: Construction on Private Property.**

(a) Poles and fixtures or underground conduit on private property must be furnished and maintained by the customer unless furnished as a part of the Authority distributing plant for serving subscribers in general.

(b) Labor and material necessary in providing pole lines or underground conduit on private property of the customer may be furnished by the customer, or by the Authority and charged to the customer at cost, at the customer's option. Title to such pole lines or conduit is vested in the customer.

(c) All construction on private property is to be under the exclusive control of the Authority as long as it is used by the Authority in the furnishing of its services, except as the control of such pole line construction may be shared with another agency using poles jointly with the Authority.

(d) Exposed wiring is the standard method of wiring in all buildings where no conduit or other means of concealment is provided. When concealed wiring is desired in buildings where no means of concealment is provided, the applicant may be charged the difference between the installation costs of

the concealed wiring and the costs of the standard exposed wiring. However, if suitable interior conduit, grooving, moulding or other similar means of concealment is provided, either by the building owner or by the applicant, the wiring is installed therein by the Authority and no charges, other than those provided for in other sections of this Tariff, will apply.

**§4154. Same: Special Types of Outside Construction.** (a) When underground construction is desired by the customer where aerial facilities ordinarily would be provided without a construction charge to the customer, the following regulations apply:

(1) Where cable is laid in conduit, the underground conduit is constructed and maintained by or at the expense of the customer. The construction charge made to the customer is based on the cost of the underground cable, including the cost of installing the cable, less the estimated cost to the Authority of installing such aerial facilities as would be required for similar use. The underground conduit shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications furnished by, or acceptable to the Authority.

(2) The duct or ducts required in the underground construction by the Authority are reserved for its exclusive use.

(3) When cable is laid in a trench, the construction charge made to the customer is based on the cost of the armored or other special type cable required, including the cost of installing the cable, less the estimated cost to the Authority of installing such aerial plant as would be required for similar use.

(4) Cable installed in conduit or trench will be maintained and replaced at the expense of the Authority. However, repairs to or replacements of, cable made necessary by damages caused by the customer, his employees or representatives will be at the customer's expense.

(b) When circuitous routing or any special type of construction is provided at the customer's request, in

cases where facilities would ordinarily be provided without a construction charge to the customer, the excess cost of the special construction is borne by the customer.

**§4155. Same: Changes from Aerial to Underground Facilities.** (a) Where aerial facilities are used to provide service or channels to a customer and subsequently the customer desires that such facilities be placed underground, the change from aerial to underground is made subject to the following conditions:

(1) The underground conduit or trench is provided and maintained by, or at the expense of, the customer.

(2) The customer is charged the cost of dismantling and removing the aerial facilities.

(3) The customer is charged the cost of the cable including its installation in the conduit or trench.

(4) The cable is maintained and replaced at the expense of the Authority. However, repairs to, or replacements of, cable made necessary by damages caused by the customer, his employees or representatives will be at the customer's expense.

**§4156. Push Button Telephone Systems: General.** (a) Push Button Telephone Systems (sometimes referred to as key telephone systems) are arrangements of wiring and equipment which, by means of push buttons or keys either in the base of the telephone set or separately mounted, provide various operating features on one or more lines.

(b) All stations connected in any Push Button Telephone System should ordinarily be located in the same building. Under certain conditions, stations may be located in different buildings on the continuous property of the subscriber and, in connection with dial selective signaling intercommunicating systems, certain stations may be located off the continuous property of the subscriber.

(c) Push Button Telephone Systems are provided in connection with individual line service, PBX service and private line service.

(d) The charges specified herein for the various operating features are in addition to other rates and charges such as for lines and stations, extension bells, station auxiliary signals and for installation and mileage charges, if any, which may apply.

(e) Sufficient station bells, including bells in the Push Button telephone sets, for the satisfactory operation of the Push Button Telephone System are provided without additional charge. For extension bells, regular rates are applied.

(f) The rates quoted contemplate the use of standard equipment. When equipment of a special type or when special wiring is desired, the determination of the rates or charges to apply will be based on the extra costs involved to meet the individual requirements of each case.

(g) Any reference to stations or Push Button telephones in §§4156 through 4161 includes adapter units.

(h) When a customer of Push Button Telephone System Service requests a change to another type of telephone service, regular service connection and installation or non-recurring charges prescribed for the substitute service requested are applicable.

**§4157. Same: Subsequent Termination of Lines.**

(a) The termination of additional central office lines or PBX station lines in a Push Button telephone system will be charged for in addition to regular service connection charges for the line.

(b) After the initial installation, if an intercommunicating line is extended so as to provide service to additional existing stations, the charge prescribed for subsequent termination of lines applies to each additional station connected.

(c) No charges apply when connecting existing lines in a system to a new station when connected at the same time the new station is installed.

(d) When a customer of Push Button Telephone System Service requests rearrangements and/or additions of lines or hookups on any of the stations to provide additional or different operating service features, the charge prescribed for subsequent termination of lines applies to each line changed or added at each station where a change or addition is made.

**§4158. Same: Extension of Lines Between Systems.** (a) Lines of one Push Button telephone system may be extended to another Push Button telephone system of the same customer on the same premises. The established extension rate and charge for each central office line or PBX station line so extended and the established station rate and charge for each intercommunicating line so extended is applicable as well as the established charge for subsequent termination of lines.

**§4159. Same: Power Supply.** The usual source of power for Push Button telephone system installations will be from locally installed rectifiers or power units. The customer will be required to furnish suitably located commercial power outlets and furnish the necessary power for the operation of the rectifier or power units. The operation of the luminous keys in the telephone instruments or the adapter units normally requires that small transformers will be installed on the customer's premises. The customer will also be required to furnish the power and power outlets for the operation of such transformers. These power supply equipment units are normally furnished at no additional charge.

**§4160. Same: Two and Three-Line Systems.** These systems consist of two-line or three-line telephone instruments which employ self-contained turn keys or push buttons and which may be operated without the use of external switching equipment. Certain of the telephone instruments are also suitable for use with larger systems which employ Type 1A Key Telephone Units (KTU's):

**§4161. Same: Multi-Line Systems.** These systems include the use of 4-button and 6-button telephone sets, 6 and 12-button adapter units and large capacity telephone sets variously referred to as Call Directors or Call Commanders. Each system is dependent on related Type 1A or equivalent Key Telephone Units (KTU's) for switching, control and miscellaneous functions such as signaling:

**(h) Installation, Move and Change Charges:**

(B) Installation charges to add Push Button strips to change a 12-button instrument to an 18-button instrument or to change a 24-button instrument to 30-button instrument will be the difference between the respective installation charges as set forth in §4161(a)(3)a preceding.

(C) There is no installation charge to convert a 18-button instrument to a 12-button instrument or from a 30-button instrument to a 24-button instrument. However, when the entire instrument must be change, such as a change from a 6-button to a 12-button instrument or a change from an 18-button to a 24 or 30-button instrument, or vice versa, no change of instrument charge applies but the established installation charge (per §4161(a) preceding) for the instrument being installed is applicable.

(D) Subsequent termination of lines, per line:

**§4162. Private Branch Exchange Service: General.**

(a) Sections 4162 through 4165 contains the regulations and rates applicable to Private Branch Exchange Service furnished by the Authority.

(b) The term *Private Branch Exchange*, referred to hereinafter as PBX, is defined in §4104, Service Definitions.

(c) The rates listed herein contemplated the use of standard equipment. When equipment of a special type is desired and where, in the judgment of the Authority, the provision of such special equipment does not create unusual training or maintenance problems, the rates will be based on the costs involved to meet the individual requirements of each case.

(d) On and after the effective date shown below, dial PBX switchboard and/or switching equipment may be provided under regulations and at rates specified in §§4162 through 4165 if listed, or under the individual agreement arrangement included in §4165 if tariff listings do not accommodate the equipment. Such agreements recognize the customized nature of PBX switching equipment and customer needs and differences in cost characteristics. To assure consistency in cost determining methodologies, rates and charges included in the agreement will be computed by using a uniform cost methodology reflecting investment quotations and annual cost (including return) experience and estimates. Individual agreements executed under this provision, together with rate and charge development data, are maintained in the Authority's permanent file and are to be filed with the Public Utilities Commission.

**§4163. Same: Regulations.** The following regulations apply in addition to the General Regulations set forth in §4105, et. seq. of this Tariff:

**(a) Availability of Service:**

(1) PBX service is available for use as the primary business exchange service for business customers to serve their employees, patients, students or transient guests.

(2) The internal communications needs of non-transient residents of residential apartment buildings, retirement homes and related facilities may be met as follows:

(A) Stations of a PBX system may be installed in the residential units provided the occupants are also primary exchange service subscribers.

(B) Stations of an isolated PBX (non-trunk connected PBX) will be installed in the residential units without restriction.

**(b) Location of Equipment:**

(1) Service is furnished subject to the provision by the customer of a location or housing determined by the Authority to be suitable for the installation of the switchboard and, in the case of a dial system, an additional location determined by the Authority to be suitable for the dial equipment. The rates for dial systems include one hundred (100) feet of cable between the switchboard and the associated dial switching equipment. Where facilities and operating conditions permit, cable in excess of one hundred (100) feet may be furnished in the same or different building on the customer's continuous property, at a charge equal to the estimated nonrecoverable costs involved.

**(c) Termination Contract:**

(1) Multiple position PBX switchboard equipment and the equipment required to provide dial PBX service will be furnished by the Authority subject to a

contract with the customer requiring that if the equipment is not retained by the customer for a period of five (5) years, the customer shall pay the Authority, upon demand, a basic termination charge comprising the total cost of the equipment and its installation less the value of the recoverable equipment plus the estimated cost of removal less a credit of 1/60th of said charge for each month the equipment was retained.

(2) Where the customer requests that additional equipment be added to the initial installation, the Authority will provide and install such additions and will apply an installation charge for the additional equipment where applicable. A supplemental termination contract may be required to cover the nonrecoverable cost of such additional installation of equipment.

(3) Moves and changes of any equipment covered by a termination contract are provided for under the terms of the contract.

(4) When any multiple PBX switchboard equipment or dial PBX system for which the initial and any supplemental termination contract period has expired is subscribed to by another customer at the same location, a termination contract is not required to be executed by the new customer. When the contract has not expired the new customer will assume the remaining liability in the contract.

**(d) Mileage Charges:**

(1) The rates as set forth in this Tariff contemplate service furnished within the base rate area. Where service is furnished outside of the base rate area, suburban mileage charges as set forth in §4147 apply to each trunk and, where required, to each power supply circuit furnished for PBX systems. Appropriate rates for isolated power supply units will apply when installed in lieu of power supply circuits.

(2) Station mileage rates as set forth in §4148 apply to each PBX station or extension located in a different building on continuous property or not on

the same continuous property on which the switchboard and/or dial equipment is located.

**(e) Miscellaneous:**

(1) When a switchboard is changed at the request of a customer, prescribed installation charges for the substitute switchboard will be applied. Regular service connection charges as listed in §4134 will apply for connection of additional PBX trunks and PBX stations. Move charges as set forth in §4138 will apply if existing stations are moved.

(2) Where a station is added subsequent to the original installation, the extension station or PBX station service connection charge as prescribed in §4134 applies even though there were initially more station lines than stations.

(3) It is the customer's responsibility to furnish and maintain the operator chairs.

(4) All operating at the subscriber's premises is performed at the expense of the subscriber and must conform with the rules and regulations of the Authority.

(5) Other miscellaneous equipment will be furnished by the Authority under appropriate tariff sections.

(6) The battery and/or ringing power supply for PBX systems may be furnished over circuits from a central office of the Authority but the method of providing such power will be determined by the Authority.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made \_\_\_\_\_ by and between the GUAM TELEPHONE AUTHORITY, called "Authority" and \_\_\_\_\_, called "Customer".

WITNESSETH

The Authority and the Customer hereby agree as follows:

(1) The Authority agrees to provide to Customer and Customer agrees to obtain from Authority the services, facilities, systems, equipment and/or features ("services") generally described as follows:

(2) For those elements of service covered by standard tariffs rates, charges, rules, regulations and conditions applicable thereto shall apply. For services not covered by standard tariffs, rates, charges, rules, regulations and conditions applicable thereto are set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and made part hereof. The term "tariff" denotes the collection of rates, charges, rules, regulations and conditions at and under which Authority holds itself out to provide services on a uniform basis and which have been approved for such purpose by the regulatory or governing body having jurisdiction over such matters. Services provided under tariffs are subject to change from time-to-time as rearrangements and changes occur. Authority, therefore, agrees to maintain a current inventory of such services, together with applicable rates and charges and to furnish such inventory to Customer upon request.

(3) Customer shall pay to Authority, for the services covered herein, the amounts set forth in Exhibit A plus amounts determined by application of tariff rates and charges upon billing by Authority for such services.

(4) Authority agrees to begin installation of equipment and facilities necessary to provide the services covered by this agreement on or before \_\_\_\_\_ and to complete such installation so that service will be provided on or before \_\_\_\_\_. Customer agrees to have floor space, commercial power sources, lighting and other accommodations satisfactory to Authority available for installation of equipment on or prior to the date on which installation is to begin. Upon execution of this agreement, Authority will order or otherwise procure equipment to supply the service in accordance with the dates specified above. In the event Customer is responsible for delay of installation beyond fifteen (15) days, rates and charges for services specified in Exhibit A will become effective. The provisions of this paragraph may be amended by mutual agreement of Authority and Customer without penalty to either party.

(5) Authority and Customer agree that the services described in Exhibit A will be provided for a period of \_\_\_\_\_ months beginning on the date installation of the equipment is completed as provided in Paragraph 4, above.

(6) In the event Customer terminates service prior to expiration of the period described in Paragraph 5, above, Customer will pay to Authority a lump sum amount computed by dividing the total investment required to provide the services covered by Exhibit A less salvage plus cost of removal and restoration costs by the total number of months constituting the total period of this Agreement, as set forth in Paragraph 5, above and multiplying the result by the number of unexpired full and partial months of the Agreement. Supersedure of the same services in place by other customers acceptable to Authority and/or waiver of these termination provisions if expanded and improved services are contracted for are permissible at the option of Authority.

(7) If Customer retains the services covered by this Agreement beyond the period specified in Paragraph 5, above, and Authority continues to provide such services with essentially the same equipment and facilities; rates, charges and conditions applicable to the services are subject to revision to recognize changed cost conditions.

(8) The provisions of this Agreement are subject to approval by the regulatory and/or governing bodies having jurisdiction over such matters. As such, this Agreement effectively becomes a tariff applicable to a specific customized utility offering.

**§4166. Miscellaneous and Special Equipment and Service: Special Equipment.** If a customer requests some special type of equipment, or a special type of service for which provision is not otherwise made, and when in the judgment of the Authority it is feasible to comply with such request, an installation charge and/or a monthly charge will be made, as determined by the circumstances in each case. A "Grant in Aid of Construction" may also be required.

**§4167. Same: Jack and Plug Equipment. (a) Regulations:**

(1) Jack and plug equipment will be furnished in connection with individual and party line service (except public, semi-public or other coin box service), PBX station lines and private lines.

(2) The right is reserved to restrict the jacks installed in connection with any one line to such number as, in the judgment of the Authority, will not adversely affect the service.

(3) Where the rate for a class or grade of service includes the provision of an instrument, it may be furnished as a portable instrument at the same rate treatment as if it were permanently connected, plus any charges which may be applicable to jacks. No additional charge applies to plugs furnished with portable instruments. One bell is provided without additional charge for each portable instrument. Not more than four (4) bells are permitted on any one line.

(4) The primary telephone station bell or an extension bell must be permanently connected to the line. Where an extension bell is permanently connected to the line, the extension bell rate applies.

(5) Regular extension mileage charges, as quoted in §§4147 through 4151, apply to jack installations extending premises other than those on which the main telephone is located.

(6) Outlet boxes and cover plates in connection with flush type jacks are furnished and installed by, or at the expense of the subscriber.

**§4168. Same: Long Cords.** (a) The standard cord furnished between the instrument and its handset (receiver cord) is approximately four (4) feet in length and normally retractable. The standard cord between the instrument and connecting block (line cord) is a straight cord approximately five and one-half (5 1/2) feet in length. When specifically requested, line cords in excess of the standard length are furnished subject to the charges and regulations specified below.

(b) Long cords are limited to a maximum of fifty (50) feet.

(c) **Installation Charges:**

**§4169. Station Auxiliary Signals. (a) General:**

(1) Station Auxiliary Signals are designed to supplement or replace the usual station ringers where such ringers do not furnish a sufficient volume of sound, or where a visual signal is desired in addition to or in place of an audible signal. Visual signals may also be furnished in connection with key telephone systems or lines to which extension stations are connected, to indicate when a line is busy.

(2) Station Auxiliary Signals for indicating incoming calls are arranged for either continuous or non-continuous operation. A non-continuous call signal is active only during the periods when the central office or private branch exchange ringing current is being applied to the line. A continuous call signal is made active by the first impulse of ringing current and remains in continuous operation until the receiver is removed at the called station.

(3) Audible signals operated by ringing current are furnished in connection with all classes of service. Audible signals operated by commercial power and visual signals are furnished in connection with individual lines and private branch exchange station

lines, except that such signals may also be furnished in connection with private lines when specific conditions do not make it impracticable to do so.

(4) Station Auxiliary Signals operated by commercial power are designed to be used in 110 volts, 60 cycle alternating current. Except for extension bells and visual signals not requiring control equipment, the power for operating the signals is furnished by the subscriber and is obtained from convenient outlets furnished, installed and maintained by the subscriber.

(5) When equipment of a special type is desired, the charges will be based upon the costs involved to meet the individual requirements of each case.

(b) Regular service connection, move and change charges, as specified in this Tariff, apply in addition to any charges applicable hereunder.

**§4181. Same: Touch Tone Dialing Service.** (a) Touch tone dialing service, sometimes called Push Button dialing service, utilizes special telephones which are equipped with numbered push buttons in an adding machine type of arrangement. These buttons, rather than the usual rotary dial, are used to originate calls. When the buttons are pushed, distinct audible tone signals are transmitted to special equipment in the central office which controls the establishment of connections to called numbers.

(b) In central offices equipped for the service, touch tone dialing is offered in connection with all types of exchange lines except party and rural lines.

(c) Standard telephones equipped with rotary dials may be used on the same line with touch tone dialing telephones if desired.

(d) Additional touch tone dialing telephones may be added as extensions of the main service at the normal extension rates listed in §4132. Normal service connection and move and change charges as shown in §§4133 through 4140 are also applicable:

**§4182. Same: Decorator and Specialty Telephones.** (a) **General.** Decorator and specialty telephone instruments differ significantly in appearance from those offered by the Authority under rates, charges and regulations shown elsewhere in these Tariffs. The Authority offers a selection of decorator telephones for installation as main or extension stations. Other decorator or specialty telephones are offered on a special order basis. Such telephones are also available at some retail stores. The terms "decorator" and "specialty" refer to the housing design and not to the telephone operating components required to provide telephone service.

(b) **Regulations.** Consistent with the Authority's responsibility to provide telephone service on an "end-to-end" basis, operating components of decorator and specialty telephones are owned and maintained by the Authority.

Decorator and specialty telephone housings are available for purchase as herein provided. The Authority does not hold itself out to maintain and/or replace damaged housings. The customer owns the housing and is responsible for its maintenance.

The Authority performs all service connection move, change, rearrangement and removal operations.

(c) **Charges.** Decorator and specialty telephones are provided by the Authority at actual cost less the cost of a standard black, white or color telephone. "Cost" includes procurement, freight, equipment and supply costs.

Telephone operating components of decorator and specialty telephones owned by the customer will be inspected, tested and replaced if necessary to assure compatibility and proper operation at a non-recurring charge of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00). Ownership of operating components will be changed by payment of a nominal consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00).

Regular service connection, move, change and rearrangement charges apply in addition to the non-recurring charges set forth herein.

(d) **Rates.** Regular monthly rates for the class, grade or type of service ordered by the customer apply to decorator and specialty telephones connected to the telephone facilities.

**§4183. Voice Recording Connections With Customer Equipment: General Regulations.** (a) **General.** Customer-owned voice recording equipment for the recording of telephone conversations may be used in connection with the facilities of the Authority subject to the following conditions:

(1) Connection with Authority facilities:

(A) Connection of customer-owned voice recording equipment with the facilities of the Authority shall be made only through recorder connector equipment which contains a device automatically producing a distinctive recorder tone that is repeated at intervals of approximately fifteen (15) seconds when the recording equipment is in use. However, in the case of private line service which has no connection with the exchange system of the Authority or with the toll system, an exception is made in that the customer has the option of using recorder connector equipment which does not contain the automatic tone device.

(B) Permanent connection shall be made only through recorder connector equipment furnished, installed and maintained by the Authority.

(C) The customer-owned voice recording equipment shall be so arranged that at the will of the user it can be physically connected to and disconnected from the facilities of the Authority or switched on and off.

(D) The customer-owned voice recording equipment must be equipped with an appropriate connecting plug before connection can be made to Authority provided connecting equipment.

(2) Responsibility of the Telephone Authority:

(A) Telephone service furnished by the Authority is not represented as adapted to the recording of telephone conversation by means of voice recording equipment. The use of customer-owned recording equipment in connection with the facilities of the Authority is permitted only on the condition that liability of the Authority for damages shall in no event exceed an amount equivalent to the proportionate charge to the customer for the period of service during which difficulty occurs as the result of:

1) Mistakes, omissions, interruptions, delays or errors or defects in transmission; or

2) Failures or defects in the recorder connector equipment occurring in the course of furnishing service or other facilities and not caused by the negligence of the customer; or

3) The Authority failing to maintain proper standards of maintenance and operation and to exercise reasonable supervision.

(3) Obligation of the Customer:

(A) The operating characteristics of the customer-owned voice recording equipment shall be such as not to interfere with any of the services offered by the Authority. Upon notice from the Authority that the equipment of the customer is

causing, or is likely to cause, hazard or interference, the customer shall make such changes as may be necessary to remove or prevent such hazard or interference.

(B) The customer indemnifies and saves the Guam Telephone Authority harmless against claim for libel, slander or infringement of copyright arising from the improper use of material transmitted over its facilities and recorded; against claims for infringement of patents arising from combining with, or using in connection with, facilities of the Authority, apparatus or systems of the customer; and against all other claims arising out of any act or omission of the customer in connection with facilities provided by the Authority.

**§4185. Special Assemblies of Equipment: Application, Definition and Regulations. (a) Application:**

(1) This tariff section applies to special assemblies of equipment furnished by the Guam Telephone Authority within the territory of Guam.

**(b) Definition:**

(1) In addition to the Service Definitions set forth in §4104, the following definition will apply.

(2) Special assemblies of equipment are designed to meet the unique requirements of a small number of

customers in conjunction with regular exchange and/or private line services and for which provision is not otherwise made in the tariffs of the Authority. Installation charges and monthly recurring charges will be based upon the total cost of the equipment and the special work required to meet the customer's request.

**(c) Regulations:**

(1) In addition to the General Regulations set forth in §4105 et. seq., the following regulations will apply:

(A) The Authority will designate the equipment to be used to meet special requirements.

(B) The Authority may discontinue the offering or specific special assemblies of equipment at any time if such action should become necessary in order to protect any of its services because of departure from the requirements associated with special assemblies of equipment.

(C) In the event of the use or intention to use special assemblies of equipment and service at locations where, in the judgment of the Authority, the service cannot satisfactorily be furnished, or for any violation of its regulations, the Authority may decline to furnish the service or discontinue service already furnished.

(D) The lines furnished by the Authority are the same as those furnished for general telephone service and are not represented as adapted to the transmission of signals or tones from equipment provided by the customer.

(E) Conduit, electrical power and any special construction required for installation or operation of sound and paging systems will be furnished at the expense of the customer:

1) The customer must provide adequate openings for flush mounted equipment. The

Authority will provide, when required, any nonstandard size electrical back boxes for installation by the customer. Wherever standard size electrical back boxes are required, the customer must provide and install them.

2) Upon removal of sound and paging equipment, the customer is responsible for closing all openings and for any other renovations required that are not due to negligence of the Authority.

**§4186. Same: Custom PBX System for Guam Horizon Hotel. (a) Application:**

(1) the following regulation, rates and charges apply to a special assembly of equipment provided to the Guam Horizon Hotel.

**(b) Regulation:**

(1) The customer is responsible for the provision of space as required for the switching equipment and associated facilities, electrical power, power wiring and outlets required as well as for environmental control when specified by the Telephone Authority.

**(c) Rates:**

(1) The customer has executed an agreement for this service for a period of five (5) years and has agreed to pay, as an aid to construction, a charge of Twelve Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty Dollars and Twenty- Three Cents (\$12,920.23) as a prepayment of the nonrecoverable costs associated with this installation.

(2) In addition to the following rates and charges, the established monthly rates and service connection charges are applicable for the central office trunk lines required for the system:

13 two-way trunks), capacity for 200 main station lines (equipped for 110 lines), standard hotel call carrying capacity per station line, 1 attendant position with auxiliary busy lamp field for 200 lines, number display, headset operation for attendant, and including the following features: station-to-station calling, direct outward dialing, in dialing via attendant, camp-on busy with attendant indication, class of service arrangement, pre-assigned night answer, call blocking, daytime transfer, power failure cut-through, automatic switchover of dial tone and ringing generators and the following amounts of house cable: 100 feet of 100 pair cable, 200 feet of 50 pair cable, 750 feet of 25 pair cable and 100 feet of 10 pair cable

(B) Each administrative main station or extension station, including standard single line instrument and wiring \$ 4.50

(D) Applicable service connection charges as set forth in §§4134 through 4140 will apply to main and extension stations installed after the initial installation of the PBX system. Move and change charges as set forth in §§4134 through 4140 will apply to moves and changes of main and extension stations.

(E) The monthly rate for any applicable main or extension station mileage will be as set forth in §§4147 through 4151.

(F) Established rates and charges will apply for other services provided in addition to those set forth in (2)(a) through (2)(e) preceding.

(G) In the event that the customer terminates the service prior to the expiration of the service period, the customer shall pay to the Telephone

Authority as a termination charge the sum of Twenty-Four Dollars and Eighty-One Cents (\$24.81) multiplied by the number of months and fraction of a month remaining under the service period at the date of termination. For the purpose of this computation, each month will be considered to have thirty (30) days.

**§4187. Same: Custom PBX System for Hotel Guam Kakuei\*. (a) Application:**

(1) The following regulation, rates and charges apply to a special assembly of equipment provided to the Hotel Guam Kakuei.

**(b) Regulation:**

(1) The customer is responsible for the provision of space as required for the switching equipment and associated facilities, electrical power, power wiring and outlets required as well as for environmental control when specified by the Telephone Authority.

**(c) Rates:**

(1) The customer has executed an agreement for this service for a period of five (5) years and has agreed to pay, as an aid to construction, a charge of Eighteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$18,500.00) as a prepayment of the nonrecoverable costs associated with this installation.

(2) In addition to the following rates and charges, the established monthly rates and service connection charges are applicable for the central office trunk lines required for the system:

(F) The monthly rate for any applicable main or extension station mileage will be as set forth in §§4146 through 4151.

(G) Established rates and charges will apply for joint user or other services provided in addition to those set forth in (2)(a) through (2)(f) preceding.

(H) In the event that the customer terminates the service prior to the expiration of the service period, the customer shall pay to the Authority as a termination charge the sum of One Hundred Fifty-Six and Sixty-One Cents (\$156.61) multiplied by the number of months and fraction of a month remaining under the service period at the date of termination. For the purpose of this computation, each month will be considered to have thirty (30) days.
