Anticipate	Be prepared for a discussion with the participants.
	Print out all activities.
Prepare	Review the power point presentation associated with this activity before conducting the lesson. Make any necessary charges to the

	power point and lesson if necessary.
Activity	If appropriate, use the power point presentation to conduct the lesson and engage the participants in a group discussion to evaluate what the participants have learned about the services provided to the public by the Judiciary of Guam.
	Using the power point and/or accompanying worksheets, discuss the following:
	 a. What are the different court services provided to the general public by the Judiciary of Guam? b. Conduct a review of the information by completing the activities: i. Activity 1 Court Services Fill in the Blank ii. Activity 2 Court Services Scramble Words c.
